

SSSC Board Members Resigned from Being Candidates in the SSSC Election

In early September 2022, a decision was suddenly announced that for any SSSC agenda items requiring a vote for any election related topics, all eight of the SSSC board members who were standing for reelection would be recused.

This was a ploy to manipulate the number of votes for these issues in favor of “one side”.

By doing this, it essentially meant that there were three SSSC board members who vote to support the Pro-Yogi Bhajan agenda to five SSSC board members who vote against the same issues.

So, for the delay of both postponing the election and disqualifying the Chinese voters (which were both “election issues”), it came down to a maximum of 4-5 people voting in favor of doing so.

Once SSSC board members started proposing changing SSSC election rules to manipulate the election, to systematically disqualify people who had registered to vote, who would not vote for them, and to automatically approve other voters who would support them, the Pro-Yogi Bhajan candidates understood that all of these proposals to change the election rules would be “rubber stamped” and many of the Pro-Yogi Bhajan community members who had registered to vote, would be eliminated. So, on October 26, 2022, three Pro-Yogi Bhajan candidates (Gurutej Singh, Harimander Singh and Siri Vishnu Singh) resigned as candidates. That meant that the Pro-Yogi Bhajan SSSC board members would now have a 6 to 5 vote on election matters, since they would no longer be recused from voting on election issues, since they were no longer candidates in the SSSC election.

Then in early November 2022, two members from “the other side” (Awtar Kaur and Gurujot Kaur) resigned in order to give their side a majority in order to manipulate the election by proposing to change the rules. At the same time, one more Pro-Yogi Bhajan candidate (Siri Pritam Kaur) also resigned.

So, as of the [Election Updates by the SSSC on November 9, 2022](#), there are only two current SSSC board members who remain as candidates in the SSSC election (GuruSangat Singh and Sahaj Singh), who will remain recused from election agenda items.

This brings the current vote count to 7 to 7 votes between the two sides on election matters. (The voting members of the SSSC Board are comprised of 15 elected board members and the Bhai Sahiba, who is a lifetime board member).
